

English

There will be four main components to our English lessons each week in Key Stage 2. Statutory spellings and spelling rules will be taught daily using Read Write Spell, a progressive scheme that builds on children's current knowledge. To learn and recall grammar skills, children will engage with 10 differentiated questions four times a week. These skills will be expanded on in writing lessons. In our writing lessons, we will also be covering modal verbs, relative clauses, plural and possessive apostrophes and inverted commas this half term. For our writing sessions, these will all stem from our learning in history, all around The Victorians. We will be writing biography on Queen Victoria, a diary entry as if they were Queen Victoria, they will create a newspaper report on the famous inventions they carried out. They will carry out a local study and a persuasive leaflet based on Scarborough in the Victorian times. The children will also continue to do a comprehension three times a week based on our current book.

Maths

Each day in Maths we will complete 10 differentiated arithmetic questions that will be marked with the children so they can check and understand the variety of methods used.

This term the topic for maths is place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. For the next half term, we will move onto Fractions.

Investigators also have a challenge station what they are encouraged to use in order to build on their knowledge, the challenge station includes various manipulative and challenge cards which they can take the opportunity to practice SAT style questions in a comfortable and accessible way.

History

Our new topic this term is 'Transport and Travel'. The main focus for this topic is Victorians, where we will be learning about the local people, the Queen and the inventions that they carried out. We will continue to solidate and develop secure knowledge and understanding of Britain, local and world history, establishing clear narratives within and across the periods. The children will also be taking part in a school trip to Beamish Museum in order to expand their knowledge on the current topic, this will take place in March. The children will also get the opportunity to come to school dressed as a Victorian for a Victorian day. This will entail a tasting menu, Victorian lessons,, rules and games – This will take place on the 27th January.
