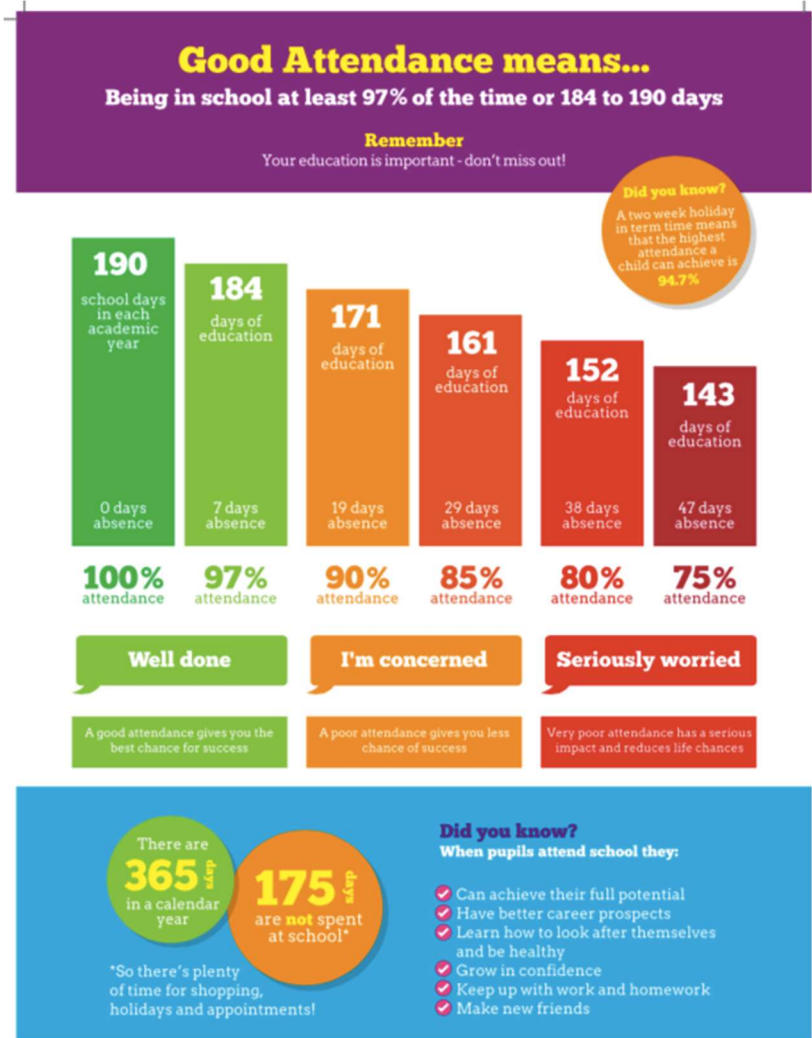

Attendance

As you may be aware, the national expectation is for school attendance to be at 96% or above. At the moment, both schools are falling well below this with Fylingdales being at 93.18% and Hawsker at 92.97%. We know that Covid has made a massive impact on these figures, but we really want to work together to support improved attendance as every day counts. Where attendance falls below 90%, it is classified as being persistent absence, and we may ask to meet families to see whether there is anything that we can do to support. We have seen a very large number of holiday requests in recent weeks. We would like to remind parents that under government guidelines, which came into effect on 1st September 2013, Head Teachers are prevented from granting any leave of absence during term time, unless there are exceptional circumstances.
